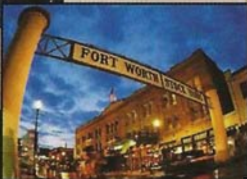
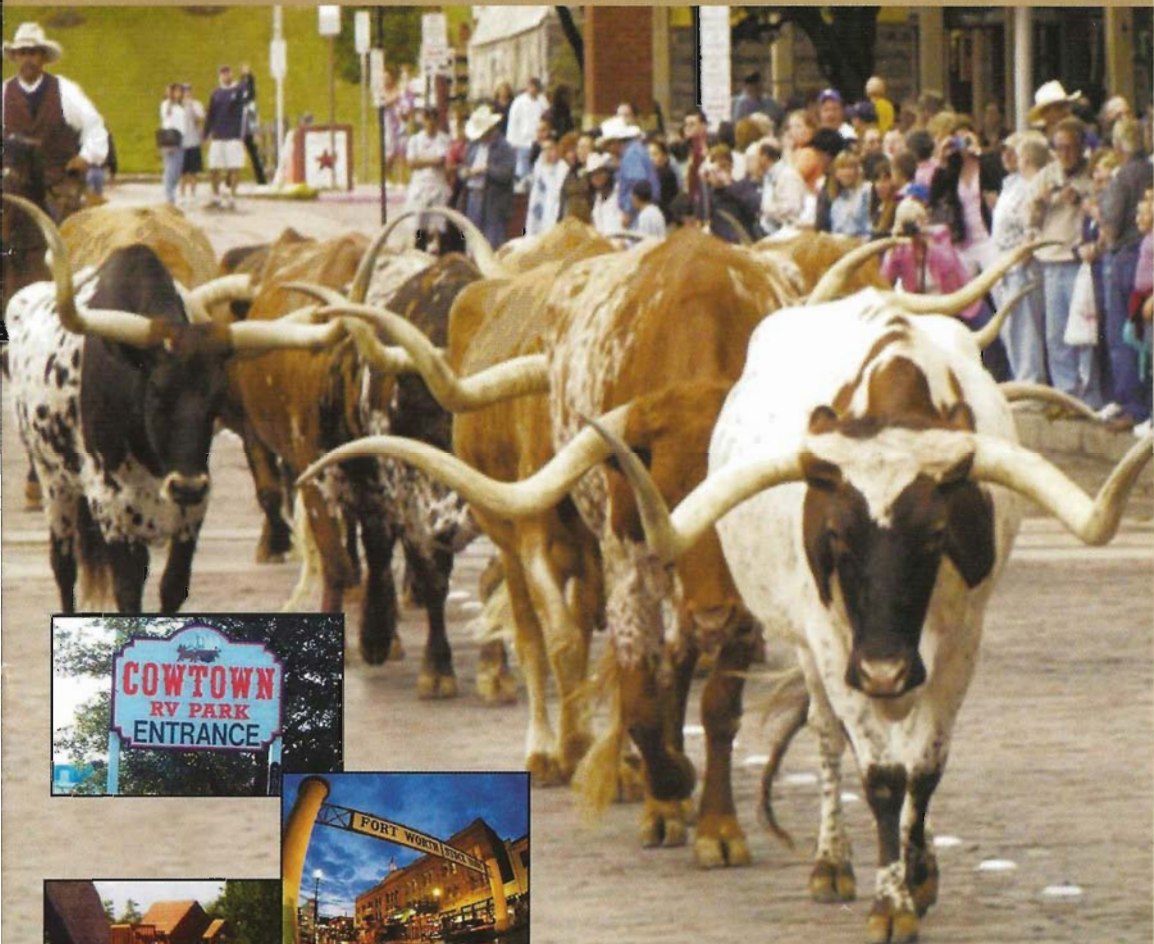

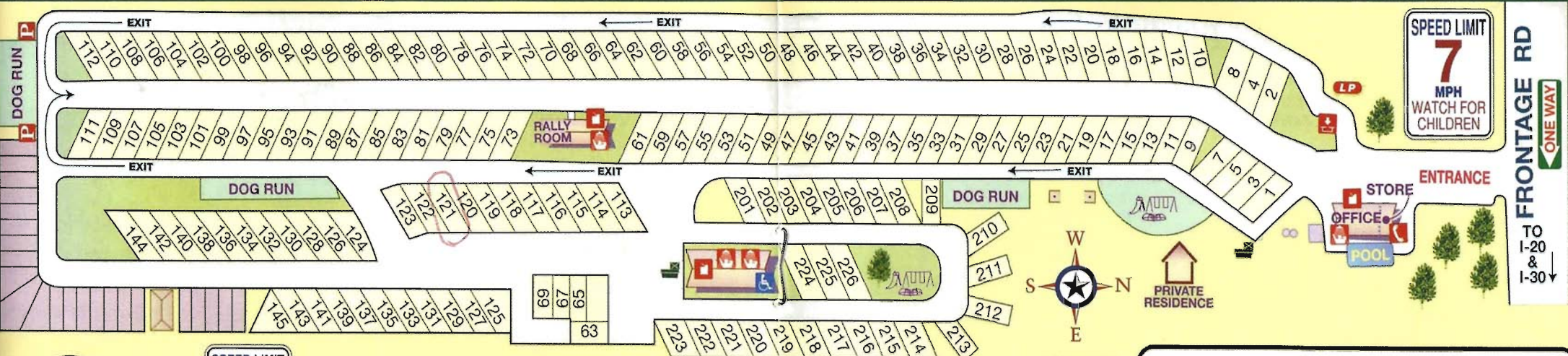

Weatherford

Weatherford, the Peach Capital of Texas, offers beautiful gardens and parks, shopping, golf, horsing around and more. Check the Chamber's website at: www.weatherford-chamber.com.

Historic Architecture - Weatherford has a vast variety of styles, from Victorian to Greek Revival to Queen Anne. There is even a Medieval "Castle on the Hill" built by the Knights of Pythias. Take a walking or driving tour of these timeless treasures.

The Courthouse - Built in 1886 this Second Empire Style Parker County Courthouse has been restored to its original splendor and can be toured.

Shopping Galore - There are numerous specialty and antique shops in historic downtown. First Monday Trade Days have been a Weatherford tradition for over 100 years. Check out the www.weatherfordparks.com website to obtain all the information.

Farmer's Market - Has been open every day in downtown Weatherford for over 100 years. It's a great spot for local produce in season and especially peaches from June to September, not to mention specialty items such as jams, jellies and pecans in the fall. And, don't forget the Parker County Peach Festival, second Saturday in July with entertainment, shopping and of course those juicy peaches.

Nature Lovers - The nation's largest pecan tree is tucked away on a local farm - call 817-596-3801 for directions. **Rails-to-Trails**, a 26-mile trail can be explored by foot, bicycle or horseback. For info call 940-328-1171.

Lake Weatherford - Go and have a great time fishing, swimming, boating and also enjoy a picnic there.

Holland Lake - has hiking trails, picnic area, playground and fishing. Check out both lakes on www.weatherfordparks.com.

Chandor Gardens - on Lee Street, has been restored to its original splendor and is open on weekends April to November and also by appointment - www.chandorgardens.com.

Clark Gardens - located at Mineral Wells, is open every day except Christmas - www.clarkgardens.com. Both parks are breathtaking.

The Western Frontier - Weatherford has a rich western heritage and is the Cutting Horse Capital of the World. You can catch a cutting horse competition almost any weekend at the

Parker County Sheriff's Posse Rodeo - is one of the best in Texas. It is held third week in June - www.parkercountysheriffsposse.com.

Greenwood Farms - is host to combined training events throughout the year, featuring the beauty of dressage, the excitement of cross country "steplechase" and the finesse of stadium jumping - www.greenwoodfarmonline.com.

Museums - The Doss Heritage and Culture Center has permanent displays featuring Mary Martin, famous for her role as Peter Pan on Broadway and her son, Larry Hagman, (J.R.Ewing) - www.dosscenter.org.

Museum of the Americas features the rich heritage and traditions of indigenous peoples from Native America, Mexico and Latin America. The museum offers hundreds of artifacts, masks, ceramics, costumes, toys and more. Free admission - www.museumoftheamericas.com.

DALLAS & FT. WORTH ATTRACTIONS

Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza - Chronicles the assassination and legacy of President John F. Kennedy. Located in downtown Dallas.

Cowgirl Museum & Hall of Fame - Visit the only museum in the world dedicated to honoring the women of the American West: pioneers, artists, writers, leaders and cowgirls! Located in Fort Worth.

Fort Worth Zoo - Visit the World of Primates, Asian Falls, the Australian Outback, African Savannah and more.

Southfork Ranch - Location of the legendary Television show "Dallas". Tour the Ewing's Mansion, watch video clips and interviews with cast members and see the gun that shot J.R. Located in Dallas.

Six Flags Over Texas - Fun for all ages from kiddies to adults, featuring thrill rides including amazing roller coasters! Concerts, parades, games, food and more. Call 817-640-8900 for more info.

Rangers Ballpark in Arlington - Home of the Texas Rangers. The stadium tour takes you to the dugout, press box, Owner's Suite and more.

Texas Motor Speedway - "The Great American Speedway". Tours include visits to the luxury suite and victory lane as well as laps around the track! Call 817-215-8565 for more info.

Fort Worth Stockyards - This National Historic District has over 25 unique shops, galleries, restaurants and a winery. Visit the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame, go dancing at a saloon and watch the daily cattle drives down the middle of the street!

Billy Bob's Texas - Don't miss a trip to the world's largest honky tonk! Built in 1910 as an open air cattle barn, it now offers concerts, dancing, restaurants, a casino and real bull riding on the weekends.

Cowboys Stadium - 900 E. Randol Mill Rd., Arlington. The ground was broken for construction in September 2005 and stadium opened May 2009. Originally estimated to cost \$650 million, the stadium was completed at a cost of \$1.15 billion. It is one of the most expensive stadiums ever built.
