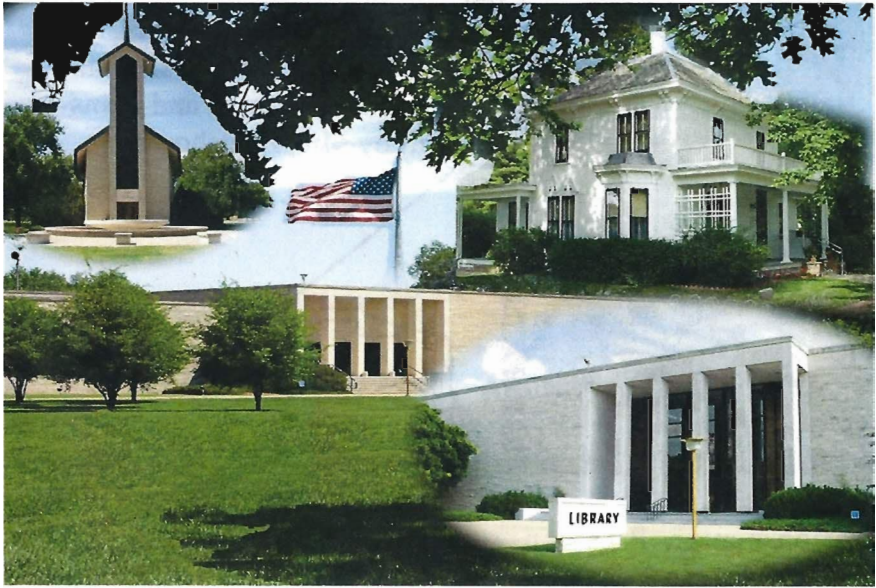

Hours of Operation: All buildings at the Eisenhower Presidential Library, Museum and Boyhood Home are open daily from 9 a.m. to 4:45 p.m., with the exception of Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day. Summer hours: 8 a.m. to 5:45 p.m. (June and July)



Boyhood Home:

The Eisenhowers lived in this house from 1898 until mother Ida Eisenhower died in 1946. The house is located on its original site and contains furniture and items left by Mrs. Eisenhower.

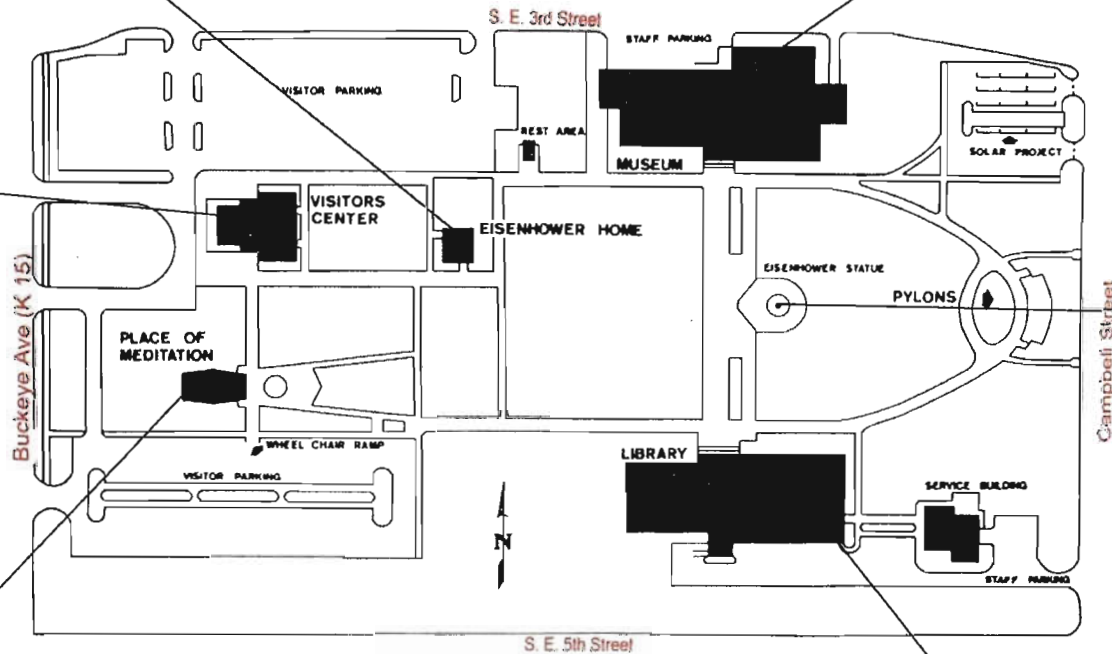
Museum:

Built by the Eisenhower Foundation with funds raised through public gifts, the Presidential Museum is constructed of Kansas limestone.



Visitors Center:

Information center, Presidential Gift Shop, and a large auditorium are located in the last building added to the complex. The orientation film, as well as many public programs are held in the auditorium.



Statue:

The eleven-foot bronze statue of General Eisenhower is located in the center of the complex.



Place of Meditation:

This is the final resting place of Dwight D. Eisenhower, Mamie Eisenhower, and their first-born son, Doud Dwight Eisenhower.

Library:

The Eisenhower Library is a working research library. The lobby and second floor gallery feature a changing exhibit.
