


The birthplace of Canada's national park system.



ICEFIELDS PARKWAY #93
Speed Limit: 90 km/hr (56 mph)

One of the world's great mountain highroads, it is named for the chain of huge icefields that roofs the Rockies. You can travel the 230 km between Lake Louise and Jasper Townsite in half a day, with time to stop and admire the views. Ask for the *Icefields Parkway* brochure. A Park Pass is required.

NOTE: This road passes through remote, high altitude terrain. Weather and driving conditions can be severe; road closures are not uncommon, especially in winter. There are no services along this route NOVEMBER - MARCH.

BOW VALLEY PARKWAY #1A
Speed Limit: 60 km/hr (37 mph)

A scenic alternative to the Trans-Canada. You can access the parkway 5 km west of Banff, at Castle Junction, and at Lake Louise. Watch out for wildlife.

USE RESTRICTION IN EFFECT:
 To protect wildlife, we ask that you do not travel on the portion of this road marked [dashed line] between Johnston Canyon and Banff, from MARCH 1 to JUNE 25, between 6 PM and 9 AM. Use the Trans-Canada Highway instead during these times. Commercial facilities along the Parkway remain open.

MINNEWANKA LOOP
Speed Limit: 60 km/hr (37 mph)

This scenic 14 km drive begins at the Minnewanka Interchange on the #1. See page 13 for a more detailed map.

TRANS-CANADA HIGHWAY #1
Speed Limit: 90 km/hr (56 mph)

This is a busy thoroughfare, drive with care! The highway is 4-lane, divided and fenced east of Castle Junction (where #93 heads south), and 2-lane, undivided and unfenced west of Castle Junction.

Look for two animal overpasses between Banff and Castle Junction, built to allow wary wildlife to cross the road safely. They are off-limits to people.
