



rk Rules

Condensed from Title 36, Part 327 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

VEHICLES

The owner of arry attended or unattended vehicle whether motorized or not is presumed responsible for its use.

Vehicles shall not be parked in violation of posted restrictions and regulations, or in such a manner as to obstruct or impede traffic, create a safety hazard, or endanger any person, properly or environmental feature. Vehicles so parked are subject to removal and impoundment at the owner's expense.

The operation and/or parking of a vehicle off authorized roadways is prohibited. Taking any vehicle through, around or beyond a restrictive sign, recognizable barrier, tence, or traffic control barrier is prohibited. Vehicles shall be operated in accordance with posted restrictions and regulations. No person shall operate any vehicle in a careless, negligent or reckless marrier. At designated recreation areas, vehicles shall be used only to enter or leave the area or individual sites or facilities unless otherwise posted.

No person shall operate any motorized vehicle without a proper and effective mutiler.

VESSELS

The owner of any attended or unattended vessel or watercraft whether motorized or not is presumed responsible for its use.

The placement and/or operation of any vessel or watercraft for a fee or profit upon project water or lands is prohibited except as authorized by permit, lease, license, or concession.

concession. Vessels or other watercraft may be operated on the project waters except in prohibited or restricted areas: All vessels or watercraft shall display all required registration on board whenever the vessel is on project waters.

No person shall operate any vessel or other watercraft in a careless, negligent, or reckless manner.

All vessels, when on project waters, shall have proper safety equipment, including personal floatation devices, on board in compliance with U.S. Coast Guard boating statistic registernates.

personal floatation devices, on board in compliance with U.S. Coast Guard boating safety requirements. Vessels or other watercraft may only be used for overnight occupancy when such use is incidental to recreational boating.

Water skis, parasalls, ski-kites, and similar devices are permitted in nonrestricted areas except that they may not be used in a careless, negligent, or reckless manner.

All vessels when not in actual use shall be removed from project lands and waters unless securely moored or stored at designated mooring areas.

All vessels must be constructed or maintained in compliance with the standards and requirements established by the Federal Safe Boating Act.

No person shall operate any vessel or watercraft without a proper and effective exhaust muffler.

AIRCRAFT

The owner of any attended or unattended aircraft whether motorized or not is presumed responsible for its use.

The operation of aircraft on project lands at locations other than those designated by the District Commander is prohibited.

No person shall operate any aircraft while on or above project waters or project lands in a careless, reckless, or negligent manner.

SWIMMING

Swimming, wading, snorkeling or scuba diving at ones own risk is permitted, except at launching sites, designated mooring points and public docks; or other designated

An international diver down, or inland diving flag must be displayed during under-

Diving, jumping or swinging from trees, bridges or other structures which cross or are adjacent to project waters is prohibited.

PICNICKING

Picnicking and related day-use activities are permitted in designated areas

CAMPING

Camping is permitted only at sites and/or areas designated by the District Com-

mander.

Camping at one or more campsites at any one water resource project for a period longer than 14 days during any 30-consecutive-day period is prohibited. The unauthorized placement of campsite equipment or other items on a campsite and/or personal appearance at a campsite without daily occupancy for the purpose of reserving it is prohibited. The digging or leveling of any ground or the construction of any structures is prohib-

Occupying or placement of any camping equipment at a campsite which is posted otherwise marked or indicated as "reserved" without an authorized reservation for that site is prohibited

HUNTING, FISHING, TRAPPING

Hunting, fishing, and trapping lire permitted in designated areas.

SANITATION

Garbage, trash, rubbish, litter, gray water, or any other waste material or liquid waste generated on the project shall be either removed from the project or deposited in receptacles provided for that purpose. It is a violation to bring onto a project any material for the purpose of disposal. Spilling, pumping or other discharge of pollutants, including human and animal waste, on project lands or into project waters is prohibited.

Project visitors shall keep their sites free of trash and litter and clean their sites upon departure.

The discharge or placin, of sewage, galley waste, garbage, refuse, or pollutants into project waters from any vessel or watercraft is prohibited.

Fires shall be confined to designated areas and then only in fireplaces, grills, or her facilities designated for that purpose. Fires shall not be left unattended and must

be completely extinguished prior to departure.

Improper disposal of lighted smoking materials, matches, or other burning material. is prohibited.

CONTROL OF ANIMALS

No purson shall bring or allow dougs, cats, or other pets into developed recreation eas or adjacent waters unless penned, caged, on a leash under six feet in length, or herwise physically restrained. No bark or emit other noise which surreasonable, to

turbs other people.

Persons bringing or allowing pets in designated public use areas shall be responsible for proper removal and disposal of any waste produced by these animals. No persons shall bring or allow horses, calife, or other svestock in camping, picnicking, swinning or other recreation areas or on trails except in designated areas.

Any pets or animals displaying vicious or aggressive behavior are prohibited and

RESTRICTIONS

The District Communicer may establish and post restrictions on the public use of a

project.

Quiet shall be maintained in all public use areas between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m., or those hours designated by the District Commander. Excessive noise during such times which unreasonably disturbs persons is prohibited.

Any act or conduct by any person which interferes with, impedes or disrupts the use of the project or impairs the safety of any person is prohibited, individuals who are bossterous, rowdy, disorderily, or otherwise disturb the peace on project lands or waters may be requested to leave the project.

The operation of any sound producing device or motorized equipment so as to unreasonably annoy or endanger others is prohibited.

The possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages on any portion of project lands or waters, or the entire project, may be prohibited by the District Commander.

Unless authorized by the District Commander, emoking is prohibited in Visitor Centers, enclosed park buildings and in areas posted to restrict smoking.

EXPLOSIVES, FIREARMS, OTHER WEAPONS AND FIREWORKS

The possession of loaded firearms, armunition, loaded projectile firing devices, bows and arrows, crossbows, and explosives of any kind, including fireworks, is prohib-ited unless used for hunting or fishing in accordance with applicable federal, state; and local laws

PUBLIC PROPERTY

Destruction, injury, detacement, removal, or any alteration of public property is pro-

The cutting or gathering of wood is prohibited except for the gathering of dead staterial on the ground for use in designated recreation areas.

The use of metal detectors is permitted on designated beaches or other previously disturbed areas unless prohibited by the District Commander, thems found must be handled in accordance with Sections 327.15 and 327.16 except for non-identifiable items such as coins of value less than \$25.

ABANDONMENT AND IMPOUNDMENT OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

Personal property of any kind shall not be abandoned, stored or left unattended

LOST AND FOUND ARTICLES

All articles found shall be deposited by the finder at the project headquarters or with a ranger.

ADVERTISMENTS

Advertising and the distribution of printed matter is allowed within project lands and waters provided that a permit to do so has been issued by the District Commander and provided that the uctivity is not solely commercial advertising.

COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES

The engaging in or solicitation of business on project lands and waters without ion of the District Commander is prohibited.

It shall be a violation of these regulations to refuse to or fall to comply with the fee requirements or the terms or conditions of any permit.

UNAUTHORIZED STRUCTURES

The construction, placing, or continued existence of any structure of any kind under, upon, in, or over project lands or waters is prohibited unless authorized by the District Commander.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Special events including, but not limited to, water carnivals, boat regatlas, fishing tournaments, music festivals, dramatic presentations or other special recreation programs are prohibited unless written permission has been granted by the District Commander.

The public shall not be charged any fee by the sponsor of such event unless the District Commander has approved in writing the proposed schedule of fees.

UNAUTHORIZED OCCUPATION

Occupying any lands, buildings, vessels or other facilities within water resource de-velopment projects for the purpose of maintaining the same as a full- or part-time residence without the written permission of the District Commander is prohibited.

RECREATION USE FEES

Fees may be charged for the use of specialized sites, facilities, equipment or ser-ies related to outdoor recreation furnished at Federal expense. Failure to pay authorized day-use fees, and/or properly display applicable receipt.

permit or pass is prohibited.

INTERFERENCE WITH GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES

Interference with any Federal employee in the conduct of his or her official duties in prohibited. Failure to comply with a lawful order shall be considered interference.

VIOLATION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS

Violations of the provisions of this regulation shall subject the violator to a fine of not more than \$5,000 or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both.

STATE AND LOCAL LAWS

State and local laws and ordinances apply on project lands and waters.
